Guide lines for creating your Works Cited Page

- 1. The works cited section of a report appears at the end and always starts a new page with the title **Works Cited** centered at the top.
- 2. Sources are alphabetized by the **first** word of the entries (usually the author's last name).
- 3. Sources are **not numbered**.
- 4. The **first** line of each entry starts at the **left** margin and the **second** line and all **succeeding** lines are indented five spaces (use the tab key).

5.	Each entry is single-spaced with a double space between entries.
